This complaint is based upon the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1871, 42 22 United States Code, sections 1983 and 1988, and the Fourth and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution. Plaintiff THALEN CURTIS FLUCKES (FLUCKES) herein complains of 25 acts and omissions which occurred during an investigation and arrest by City of San Bernardino police officers after a call for help from an mentally impaired woman stating that her husband (Plaintiff FLUCKES) was non violent but

- 1 verbally causing her distress. Police Officers arrived and were asked by the
- 2 reporting party to take her to a mental ward, there were no reports or evidence of
- 3 violence. Police officers disregarded all available information and attacked and
- 4 beat Plaintiff FLUCKES, and charged him with violation of California Penal Code
- 5 section 148. 3. ALLEGATIONS
 - Plaintiff THALEN CURTIS FLUCKES, alleges as follows:
- 7 Jurisdiction is conferred upon this Court by 28 United States Code section
- 8 | 1331 (federal question) and 28 United States Code section 1343, subdivision 3
- 9 (civil rights), and on the pendent jurisdiction of this Court to hear claims arising
- 10 under state law. Venue lies in the Central District of California, the judicial
- 11 district in which the claim arose, pursuant to 28 United States Code section 1391,
- 12 subdivision b.

- 13 **4. PARTIES**.
- 14 Plaintiff THALEN CURTIS FLUCKES is an African American male
- 15 resident of Highland, California.
- 16 5. At all times material herein Defendants CARLOS LARIZ and AHMED
- 17 were duly appointed, qualified and acting City of San Bernardino Police Officers,
- 18 and at all times herein mentioned each Defendant was acting within the course and
- 19 scope of such employment and under color of law.
 - FACTS.

- 21 6. The acts, omissions, and events herein described and complained of
- 22 occurred on or about March 27, 2009, at approximately 7:00 p.m at 3458 20th St.
- 23 Highland, CA 92346.
- 24 7. On or about the date, time, and place aforementioned, FLUCKES was at his
- 25 home with his wife Lisa Fields, and their daughter Emily Fluckes.
- 26 8. Lisa Fields is bi polar and requires regular treatment for that condition, and
- 27 she requires hospitalization from time to time. City of San Bernardino police
- 28 officers have been called upon in the past to transport her for medical treatment for

- 1 her mental condition.
- 2 9. On or about the date, time, and place aforementioned, Lisa Fields called
- 3 911 for emergency assistance. She reported to the 911 Operator that her husband
- 4 (Plaintiff FLUCKES), was "putting her down". She emphasized repeatedly that
- 5 there was no violence, no hitting.
- 6 10. In response to questions by the 911 Operator, Lisa Fields reported that her
- 7 husband FLUCKES was a Black Male.
- 8 11. The 911 Operator advised that she would send officers to "talk to
- 9 everybody".
- 10 | 12. Defendant LARIZ arrived at 3458 20th St. in response to the 911 call of
- 11 Lisa Fields, followed shortly thereafter by Defendant AHMED. Both Officers
- 12 noted that the occupants of the home were African American.
- 13 | 13. Lisa Fields reported to LARIZ that she was not the victim of violence, and
- 14 she stated that she needed help for her mental condition.
- 15 14. Lisa Fields asked LARIZ to arrange for her to be taken to a hospital for her
- mental condition. LARIZ refused her request.
- 17 15. Defendant LARIZ contacted Plaintiff FLUCKES inside the home, and noted
- that he met the description given by the 911 Operator, a "Black Male".
- 19 16. Plaintiff FLUCKES asked defendant LARIZ for assistance in providing
- 20 mental health care to Lisa Fields. LARIZ refused his request.
- 21 17. Defendant LARIZ ignored statements by Lisa Fields and Plaintiff
- 22 FLUCKES that there was no violence, and he noted that there was no physical
- 23 evidence whatsoever of violent behavior, and he noted that Lisa Fields and
- 24 FLUCKES were African American.
- 25 18. Defendant LARIZ asked FLUCKES to exit the home and FLUCKES
- 26 complied.
- 27 19. Shortly after FLUCKES exited the home, defendant AHMED arrived.
- 28 20. Defendant AHMED noted that FLUCKES was African American.

- 21. Plaintiff FLUCKES requested that Lisa Fields be taken to a hospital for treatment of her mental condition, and Defendants LARIZ and AHMED refused to take any action whatsoever on this request, but responded with the statement that they were "not a fucking taxi service".

 5 22. On or about the date, time, and place aforementioned Plaintiff FLUCKES
- On or about the date, time, and place aforementioned Plaintiff FLUCKES was carrying no weapons on his person and there were no weapons in his home.
- 7 23. On or about the date, time, and place aforementioned Plaintiff FLUCKES had committed no crime.
- 9 24. On or about the date, time, and place aforementioned no crime was reported to have been committed.
- 25. Defendants LARIZ and AHMED threw plaintiff FLUCKES to the ground,
- and beat him with closed fists about the head, face, chest, back, and applied
- pressure by knees to elbow, legs, and back.
- 14 26. Plaintiff FLUCKES attempted to protect himself from the unprovoked and
- 15 unlawful beating, and he never attacked his assailants.
- 16 27. Defendants LARIZ and AHMED falsely accused and cited FLUCKES for
- violation of California Penal Code section 148 when they knew that no crime had
- 18 been committed by FLUCKES.
- 19 28. Plaintiff FLUCKES was charged with violation of California Penal Code
- 20 section 148, San Bernardino Superior Court Case #MSB902136.
- 21 29. San Bernardino Superior Court Case #MSB902136. was dismissed by the
- 22 Court on August 17, 2009.

FEDERAL CIVIL RIGHTS VIOLATION

FOURTH AMENDMENT, EXCESSIVE FORCE

- Plaintiff refers to and incorporates herein by reference the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 29 herein as if set forth in full.
- 28 30. On or about the date, time, and place aforementioned, Defendants LARIZ

and AHMED, ans DOES 1 through 10 deprived Plaintiff FLUCKES of the right to security of the person from unreasonable search and seizure and unjustified force in violation of the Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution, and of substantive due process of law in violation of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution, in that at or about said date, time and place, said defendants knowingly and wilfully acted as herein described. PLAINTIFF'S SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION 7 FEDERAL CIVIL RIGHTS VIOLATION 8 FOURTH AMENDMENT, FALSE ARREST 9 Plaintiff refers to and repleads each and every allegation contained in 10 B1. paragraphs 1 through 29 of this complaint and by this reference incorporates the same herein and makes each a part hereof. Defendants LARIZ and AHMED and DOES 1 through 10 detained and 13 B2. arrested Plaintiff FLUCKES without probable cause, and thereby unlawfully exercised their authority to seize, restrain, detain and confine Plaintiff. PLAINTIFF'S THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION 16 17 FEDERAL CIVIL RIGHTS VIOLATION FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT, 18 RACIALLY MOTIVATED POLICE MISCONDUCT 19 Defendants LARIZ and AHMED and DOES 1 through 10 observed that the 20 reporting party was African American and treated her differently than a similarly situated white female and displayed racial animus by ignoring her request for medical care. 23 Defendants LARIZ and AHMED and DOES 1 through 10 observed that 134. 24 Plaintiff FLUCKES was African American and treated him differently than a similarly situated white male and displayed racial animus by ignoring his request for medical care for the reporting party Lisa Fields, by ordering Plaintiff to exit his home, and by their unprovoked and unlawful attack on him.
